A WONDERFUL BOOK.

Speaking of the Bible at a meeting of the British and Foreign Bible Society in Toronto Monday evening, Rev. Robert Johnston, D. THEATRICAL MAN CHANGED HIS PLEA BEFORE GOING TO CELLS

Kenneth McLeod Admits Stealing Costumes and Fraudulently Obtaining Money.

In this morning's police court, McLeod requested until tomorrow to consider whether or not he should accept summary trial. He was in hopes, it is said, that a relative would arrive to help him settle, as far as the goods were concerned. As to his stealing, that will have to be settled by the court. Before being taken back to the cell, McLeod asked the magistrate to be allowed to reconsider his request for remand until tomorrow, which had been granted, and he then pleaded guilty, also to another charge.

The other charge was that of fraudulently getting \$38.50 from three members of the Knights of Pythias in this city last January.

Last evening's Hamilton Spectator, in speaking of Detective Egleton's arrival for the prisoner, said:

"There was quite a flutter in police circles this afternoon when Detective Egleton, of London, walked into the office. This London officer is known to fame as being one of the two who shot the London desperado, who endeavored to 'rescue his pal, 'Texas,' while the latter was in custody of the police. Detective Egleton is a very unassuming sort of officer, and speaks of the shooting with great modesty, even going so far as to deny all complicity in the matter, quite embarrassed when spoken to on the matter, and declared that he was not boasting about what he did."

McLeod traveled the country putting on shows. In January last he went to Port Huron, where he visited the estuary of the Detroit River. He loaned him the above costumes. He did not pay for them, but disappeared from the city. Learning that the costumes were in the hands of Mr. Lomasney, he sent her daughter here, and the articles were unearthed in a local pawnshop.

The police here knew that McLeod was in Hamilton, so they wired for his arrest, and Detective Egleton brought him back last evening.
