ROSS SAYS HE SHOT

Statement by Slayer of Percy Parkinson On the Eve of His Execution.

North Bay, June 21. - Walter Ross, who was executed here today for the murder of Percy Parkinson, sitting in his narrow cell, with the shadow of death hovering over him, and with the full knowledge that he had only a brief time to live, gave the following interview to a press representative: "I am thirty-three years of age; 'I was born in England; the place does

in self-defence. I had been in the Cobalt country about three years, and Parkinson and I were partners. The quarrel leading up to the tragedy was spread over a period of three or four days, and arose over a dispute about the division of interests on some mining claims we held. Parkinson seemed to get in a frenzy when bad tem-
