THE PROVINCIAL ESTIMATES.

Mr. Wood brought down his estimate for the year ending Dec. 31, 1882, yesterday. He was altogether \$2,386,728.

There is no mention of new parliament buildings or provision therefor. For the maintenance of government houses \$6000 is asked, and an additional \$4000 for general repairs, furniture, etc. All the asylums and prisons are to have considerable amounts expended on them in the way of improvements.

A cottage for sixty patients, adjoining the Kingston asylum, is to cost \$18,000. For legislation \$100,000 is asked, including \$35,000 for indemnity to and advances of members. Government house has \$1800 worth of gas, and the parliament building \$1700.

There is a decrease of \$6533 in the estimates for superannuation, and an increase of \$48,332 in the maintenance of public institutions (asylums, prisons and colleges). For preventing the prize fight at Long Point, in 1882, \$173 is asked. The telephone bill runs over a thousand dollars. Three cottages for the study of agriculture at the college are to cost \$6400. On the Niagara river \$1000 is to be expended in dredging the channel at the dam at Young's point on the Ontario and \$3052 on the Gull river dam. Colonization roads will cost \$125,000. The principal new roads are in Thudler Bay District, Bruce Mines and Manitowish Island.

For the supplementary estimates will include more yet to be seen.

SUPPERIOR JAIL BREAKERS.

A Big Exodus from a Rochester Prison—Seven Convicts at Large.

ROCHESTER, N. Y., Feb. 13.—The old rooming house known as the Monroe county jail was delivered this afternoon of eleven prisoners. The escape was made through a hole through the outside wall, and then through a hole in the south wing. The south wing has been used to confine the most desperate prisoners in the jail.
