

to listen to the gospel Only one young man remained with his mother. Many Esquimaux arrived in the following year [1832] for the sake of trade, but when the brethren advised them to make the salvation of their soul their chief concern, they all began to offer excuses, yet on being spoken to about the consequences of death, they did not, as formerly, treat it with levity, some even appeared thoughtful after such conversations, and five persons removed from the heathen to the settlement Of those who had resided with them for some time, they had the pleasure, on Easter Sunday, to baptize four adults and one child, being the first accession to the church at Hebron from among the heathen. The number of their congregation in August, the date of their latest accounts, amounted in all, to 162 persons, of whom 72 had joined from Okkak, and 10 from Nain.
