Although, as will be seen by the analysis, the bowling of Dudley and Conolly was very effective, the home team need scarcely have presented but one double figure in their two innings. Gamble, Redmond, Bethune, and Dudley batted well for the winners, whose six-wicket victory was very creditable. Campbell, for the losing side, went in when three wickets had fallen for 0 runs, and was last out. He stole many sharp runs, but his eagerness proved fatal to both himself and his captain. The Trinity bowlers were all well on the spot, though none proved very successful. D. Howard was an absentee in the first innings, and Brent, his substitute in the field, distinguished himself by making four catches. Most of the holding was very in-different, but the 8 byes recorded against Trinity were due mainly to the misfortunes of the long stop, who received several nasty blows. The throwing in on the same side was noticeably bad. The wicket was good though slow, but the long grass in the outfielding spoiled many a run, and was anything but creditable to the executive.
