But the third visitor, it came and went in the night; no one saw or heard it; it was late and dark, and all the world was asleep, so it just left a small token to say it called; for when morning came, there upon the floor in the next room, fluttering in every little breath of air. was a long, white, silken robe, as fine as the finest silk muslin, worked in stars on one side and bars on the other; it had been made to fit exactly; it was not too wide in the back or too narrow in front; it was long, and had covered the wearer from head to foot, even the little holes for the eyes were there, though carefully covered with fine silk stitching, but the place for the mouth was so very large, indeed, that must have been the way, it took it off. But who could the wearer have been ?-A anako.
