The English Army and Navy Gazette rocommends that an increased degree of practical education be secured to those who are in future to have the command of the ships and fleets, by appointing to the ironclads, months, or certainly weeks, before the vessels are fully commissioned, the captains and commanders, as well as the chief officers of the executive, engineers', and carpenters' departments, with a view to the'r making themselves thoroughly acquainted with the many contrivances- pipes, cocks, valves, engines, etc., with which such ships are now fitted.
