



- a) The game so far is on ordinary lines. This move does not improve White's development.
  b) The right reply to White's inactive move.
  c) If Black play now B x B then Kt will remain badly posted, and is a loss of time in any event.
  d) Another inactive move, while Black develops his game.
  e) This does not seem profitable.
  f) Good introduction to an attack, viz., P-K Kt 4, etc.
  g) White threatened to Castle on Q side followed by R-K Kt 1. B.'s advance is just in time.
  b) It is difficult to suggest a better move.

- (g) White threatened to Castle on Q side followed by K.—K. Kt. 1. B. s advance is just 1
  (h) It is difficult to suggest a better move.
  (j) Black boldly runs the risk of isolated Pawns in case of an end game.
  (k) P.—B 4 would lead to interesting complications in which Black could give up the Kt.


