

- OAS**
- Launching a mine clearing program in Guatemala.
 - Expanding the number of trained deminers who could be made available to the international community after the year 2000.
- OAU**
- Implementation of the Plan of Action adopted at The First Continental Conference of African Experts on Landmines at Kempton Park.
- Physicians for Human Rights**
- Offer to convene a meeting to establish standardized methods to collect information and report on mine incidents, with NGO, International Agency and state involvement.
- UNA-USA**
- "Adopt-a-Minefield" program, by which minefields identified by the UN will be paired with adoptive communities in the USA and abroad that will raise funds for their demining.
- UNDP**
- Proposed establishment of a Mine Action Centre, in a mine-infested developing country, to focus on training of trainers in survey, minefield information systems, mine awareness, assistive devices and networking. The Centre would promote the sustainability of global efforts through the development of national capacities. It would increase coordination among programs worldwide by providing a forum for sharing lessons learned.
- UNICEF**
- Promote mine awareness through international distribution and promotion of the animated video *The Silent Shout: Helping Children Learn About Landmines* (with Canada's assistance).

MINE VICTIM ASSISTANCE

The Convention clearly recognizes the need to provide assistance for the care, rehabilitation and social and economic reintegration of mine victims.

- EU**
- Contribution of up to ECU 8 million to the ICRC for assistance to mine victims.
- Holy See**
- Contribution of US \$100,000 to the ICRC for victim assistance.
- Norway**
- *Norwegian Mine Victim Support Strategy*. In support of the ICRC's comprehensive mine victim assistance program, Norway will contribute US \$20 million over a five-year period.
- ICBL**
- National campaigns to promote the establishment of an international day for mine victims.
