TRANSPORTATION-EFFECT OF NEW FREIGHT RATES ON MARITIMES

Mr. Robert C. Coates (Cumberland): Mr. Speaker, I have a grievance. I suppose I should say my main grievance is the fact that we did not win this vote. To be more realistic, I should like to say that there is no matter of more immediate concern to the Atlantic provinces than transportation, especially when it affects the movement of goods in or out of the area. This must obviously be evident to the new Minister of Transport (Mr. Hellyer), and to the government, as a result of the decision of the Board of Transport Commissioners on August 2 to allow the new non-carload tariff which became effective on September 2.
