PROTOTYPE HYDROFOIL ANTI-SUB-MARINE VESSEL

2. When is it now expected that this vessel will be delivered to the Canadian Navy at Halifax?

Hon. C. M. Drury (Minister of Industry): 1. The Department of Defence Production. the Department of National Defence and the ship's prime contractor, have undertaken a joint assessment of the extent of fire damage as well as technological and supply problems and costs associated with the carrying out of repairs to the hydrofoil ship. It is anticipated that this review will be completed within the next two months and will provide reliable cost and schedule data for both rectification of damage and completion of ship construction at Sorel, P.Q. Pending completion of the joint review, initial estimates place costs directly attributable to the fire at between \$3.5 million and \$4 million. Consequential effects of the fire may be in excess of \$1 million.

2. Until completion of the assessment, the delivery date cannot be forecast with any degree of accuracy.
