Has the Department of National Health and Welfare undertaken any studies on the inclusion of optometry and dental services into Medicare and, if so (a) what were the names of the studies (b) by whom were they undertaken (c) how much did each cost?

Hon. Marc Lalonde (Minister of National Health and Welfare): The department periodically estimates the cost to the people of Canada of various health care services other than those covered by the major insurance programs—both under present arrangements and if provided as an insured service. Optometry and dental services are among the health care services considered. These estimates are prepared by experts within the department and the cost is absorbed as part of the annual program administration expenditure. The studies, being entirely in-house, are unnamed.
