but more particularly, this feature means that the government's energy policies have a major impact back home.

The riding of Montreal-Mercier has a population of nearly 100,000 including some 35 per cent with so-called ethnic backgrounds. Most of my constituents are very hard workers. We all feel like a very large family and share a very strong desire for change. Young and old, we are all concerned and affected by unemployment and other current social problems. But there is hope for the future and we are looking forward to a renewed confidence in our country and ourselves. My constituents have put their trust in the new conservative government to improve their social and economic conditions.

In conclusion, I should like to emphasize that our Prime Minister's honesty, sincerity and conviction have already marked the new government and its members. Unity in this Government will be our strength and all together we will build a new Canada in keeping with the aspirations of the Canadian people and their wishes stated on September 4 last.
