For Thursday, 1st March, 1888.

By the Honorable Mr. Macdonald (B.C.):—

- 5 February 27—That he will enquire whether any answer has been received to the question submitted in December, 1886, by the Imperial and Dominion Governments to the Government of the United States, viz.: Whether British vessels fishing in the open seas beyond the territorial waters of Alaska would be exposed to seizure, and Her Majesty's Government at the same time would be glad if some assurance could be given that, pending the settlement of the question, no such seizures of British vessels will be made in Behring's Sea.

By the Honorable Mr. Macdonald (B.C.):—

- 6 February 27—That an humble Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor General, praying that His Excellency will cause to be laid before this House, all correspondence subsequent to May, 1887, between the Imperial and Dominion Governments and the Government of the United States, relating to international rights in Behring's Sea and to the seizure of British vessels therein by armed vessels of the United States.
