By arrangements of the Smithsonian Institution, Washington, gifts of Books can be transmitted free of charge from London to any Town in the United States. The offer is made of the Books in Sheets, partly because this is preferred by the Managers of many Public Libraries; but they may be bound here at an average charge of 8d. per Volume.'

'At the risk of appearing to offer with one hand, and to beg with the other, which would not correctly represent my design, I may state that times innumerable I have been grieved at the loss of valuable lives through Malarious Fever in Central Africa, and at some Missionary Stations in other lands. I have not the knowledge required for a comparison of these fevers with the Malarious Fevers of Italy, but I believe them to be similar if not identical; and under this impression I have prepared detailed accounts of what has been done, and what has been effected by Plantations of the *Eucalyptus Globulus* or *Blue Gum-tree* in counteracting the insalubrious effects of residences near marsh lands in that country, and of the natural history of the Microbe to which the fatal disease is attributed, and I am ready to give the manuscript to any one who will meet the expense of printing it, for extensive distribution in lands in which such fevers prevail, on the sole condition of fifty or a hundred copies being placed at my own disposal.

'The expense I reckon may be about £50. There are embodied in the memoir or report translations of two French reports in regard to the success of the enterprise, the expense of printing either of which might be about £5, and I am ready to carry either through the press on the same terms if the whole be not printed,
