Connolly & Co. That he used the Minister's name before the Harbour Commissioners, and that from 1882 to the present Session of Parliament he lived in the same house as the Minister, thereby giving the impression to Larkin, Connolly & Co., that he had absolute control over him and that he was acting as the Minister's representative in his corrupt transactions with them.

59. That the said Thomas McGreevy on several occasions demanded in the name of the Hon. Minister of Public Works and received from Larkin, Connolly & Co. sums of money. 60. That from 1882 to the present Session the said Thomas McGreevy has always lived in the same house as the Hon. Minister of Public Works, and that he seems to have done so in order to put in the mind of Larkin, Connolly & Co. the impression that he had over said Hon. Minister an absolute control and that he was acting as his representative in his correct transactions with them

corrupt transactions with them. 61. That in fact on many occasions he used the name of the Hon. Minister of Public Works in his dealings with them, undertaking to obtain his co-operation or declaring that he had secured it.
