It was 1.14 occook when Richard Greenwood towed the boat out into Auditia River from Chippawa Creek, and the wind caught it and causted it and the wind caught it and caused it ashore on Hog Island. Greenwood then towed it out hearty to midstream. James Mitchell, the 80-years-old insentor of the life boat, boarded a waiting trolley car and was rushed to Table Rock House, where several hundred persons were waiting to see the craft make its 158 feet drop over the catarract.

The lifeboat was carried toward the shore of Goat Island as it neared the falls. 
