SALISBURY'S NEW IDEA.

A Fresh Proposal in Regard to Settlement of Indemnity WHICH GREECE HAS TO PAY TO TURKEY.

He Suggests That Great Britain, France and Russia Guarantee It

Constantinople, Aug. 26.—Lord Salisbury has made a fresh and important proposal in the matter of the settlement of the indemnity due Turkey from Greece. He suggests that Great Britain, France and Russia jointly guarantee the indemnity loan and control the revenues set apart for the purpose of meeting this obligation.

Only After the Most Desperate Fighting Did They Enter the Fort. Simla, Aug. 26.—The Afridis attacked Fort Luni-Kotal Tuesday. The garrison held its own until 10 o'clock Wednesday morning, when, after a long and desperate hand-to-hand conflict, the garrison was killed, while gallantly leading his men, the enemy gained entrance.
