Lord Kitchener has applied his financial genius to the problem, as be did in the Soudan, and he believes that the cost of the change need not be more than about f70,000 a year for five years. Under the new plan the chief generals, who now have their headquarters in Ma-dras, Bombay and Ben,al, will command field armies on the frontier, each ready to move actively at a day's notice. As previously reported in The Express, Lord Kitchener is also reconstructing both the training and the equipment of the In-dian army.
