Breach of Good Faith, Says Ross.
P. D. Ross of the Olympic committee, meeting about the result of the federation meeting, replied that the committee would have nothing to say about it until the Olympic committee met, which would be in the fall. He said that he was on his summer vacations. But as regards Boyd's statements about himself, personally Mr. Boyd said that he was not in the first place, what Mr. Boyd said about an alleged conversation in June last was not true. There was no conversation between Mr. Boyd and himself. He never revisa his memory. In the second place, in the conversation to which Mr. Boyd referred, he said that he was not there nor what Mr. Boyd alleged. In the third place, even if they had been so, the publication of any part of such a talk by

lost faith and honor, seeing that the conversation had been a private chat in Mr. Ross' office, where Mr. Boyd called to introduce Lusher, who wanted to secure the purchase of some of the steamship tickets for the Olympic team.

"The reason I remember the date," said Mr. Ross, "is that I made a note at the time in the matter of tickets."

Mr. Ross added: "I cannot understand how any one could violate private decency in such a manner as Mr. Boyd does, and I am sure that the public would be shocked if they knew the facts."

Boyd, with a protest in his pocket against the committee, could accept, as he did in England, and the trust of the Olympic committee, as one of its representative committee members, all the while contemplating treachery against the entry, which the Olympic committee had made a month earlier, and against which in the meanwhile neither Mr. Boyd nor any other person in amateur athletic federation had entered word of question."
