FOUNTAIN PEN LEADS TO HIS CONVICTION

Boston, Sept. 27.—A fountain pen filed
with ink of a peculiar green was the key
link in a chain of circumstantial evidence
which convicted Willis T. Snyder of larceny
by means of bad checks in the
municipal court here. Snyder told a
straightforward story, and had it not
been for the green ink and the fountain
pen would have gone free.

The police charge that Snyder got
also by the names of William T. Snyder,
C. P. Snyder and E. E. Drake. He was
arrested at the Hotel Lennox on Sept.
16 by Inspector John Linton, charged
with larceny in two counts from the Ho-
tel Touraine last summer.

When arrested he had but a single
dollar in his possession, although he had
hired a room at the Lennox, and the po-
lice found a "queer" check for \$25 in his
room.

They say that on June 30 he passed a
bad check for \$50 on the Hotel Touraine
under the name of R. D. Snyder, and
that on July 3 he passed another check
for \$21.20. They say he is wanted in
New York and Baltimore.

The prisoner told Judge Burke that he
had never registered at the Touraine
but that his brother, Carl, had stopped
there last summer. He said it was a
case of mistaken identity, and that the
police had confused him with his brother.
He explained the presence of several
blank checks in his baggage by saying he
had put some of his brother's things in
his bag.

He and his brother are telegraphers,
he said. His story was perfect to this
point, when it developed that the Tour-
aine checks were indorsed with ink of
peculiar green color. Inspector Linton
produced a fountain pen, which the pris-
oner acknowledged was his and showed
the court that it contained ink of a color
identical with that of the indorsements.

Why this should be so the prisoner
could not explain. He said he had filed
the fountain pen with green ink in Cal-
cago, some weeks ago. Judge Burke de-
cided that the indorsements had been
written by the prisoner himself, with the
fountain pen, and finding him guilty
sentenced him to six months in the
House of Correction.
