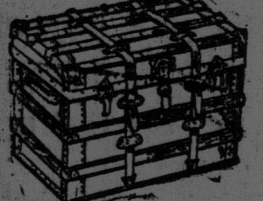

LITTLE GIRL DIES OF BURNS

Boston, July 27.—Mary Mulvey, 6-year-old daughter of Mrs. Della Mulvey of South End, who was fearfully burned while playing with matches, died at the City Hospital. She recovered consciousness for but a few minutes from the time she was carried to the hospital in the arms of Policeman Hazlett until her death. The case is a particularly sad one, as Mrs. Mulvey is a widow in needy circumstances and has two other children, neither of whom are old enough to do any work. A fourth child died only a few days ago.
