BOSTON WOMEN'S AID SOCIETY SPEND \$120,946 IN WORK IN LAST YEAR

The Boston Children's Aid Society disbursed \$120,946.34 during the last year, according to the report of Treasurer Richard Austin made at the annual meeting of the society this week.

Bequests and legacies aggregating \$35,683.50 were received during the year, while contributions netted \$42,619, payments by parents and relatives, \$23,824.53, receipts from other organizations, \$5,963.71.

The report of the general secretary, Prestice Murphy, showed 1,216 applications during the year, involving a total of 2,572 children whose needs were

considered. A total of 498 children were cared for in foster-homes, involving 15,807 weeks of care.

Special reference was made to the necessity for enlarging the work with the Judge Baker Foundation, to the necessity of a council of social agencies in Boston, to research and study of methods and for a larger measure of social work being done by the state. Out of approximately 600 social agencies of various kinds operating in Boston there are in round numbers not more than 30 doing children's work of a general protective or foster-care type, and of these 30, six are supported out of public funds and the remainder include a number of day nurseries.

The necessity for larger funds for these agencies during the coming year was emphasized.

DUMP HUN GUNS IN RIVER.

London, Eng., Nov. 20.—Four German guns which had been presented to Farnham were removed from a park there, where they had been placed on exhibition, and thrown into the river. The "cannon party" is said to have been numerous, and, like the Boston tea party of American fame, they worked silently but effectively. Relatives of soldiers slain in the war had protested that the guns were objectionable and unpleasant reminders of their bereavement.

PIG HAS SIX LEGS.
Whitehouse, N. J., Nov. 20.—John Leichte, a farmer living near here, has a freak pig that is attracting much attention. The pig was born with six legs. The extras have grown from the inside of the front legs and are of good size, one of them being the same length as the normal leg on that side and the other extra leg is almost as long.
