The death of Mrs. Rose Quinn, widow of James Quinn, took place at her late residence, 40 Sheriff street, last evening. She was in her 80th year. Two sons, Thomas and James, of this city, and three daughters, Mrs. William Crowley, Boston; Miss Margaret, Danvers (Mass.); and Miss Teresa, of this city, survive.

## Adjutant John Baird

The death occurred in this city yesterday of Adjutant John Baird, who has been in charge of the Salvation Army Chatham street corps for some time. He was born in Portage La Prairie, Manitoba, and came to St. John in October from Brandon (Ont.). He was thirty-four years of age and had been ill for about three weeks. He is survived by his wife and two children. Adjutant Baird had been connected with the Salvation Army for twelve or fourteen years, and during that time had commanded some of the leading corps in Canada.
