Oxford, Nov. 21—A. N. S. Jackson, dean of Oxford University athletics and treasurer of the Oxford University Athletic Club, denies that the new rules limiting the eligibility of Rhodes scholars to compete in the university sports are the direct outcome of recent victories by students. He says it was discussed in 1911, and that unless some action along this line had been taken, the Oxford University Athletic Club soon would have ceased to exist because all the energy and enthusiasm of the public school boy would have been dampened.
