MORNING NEWS OVER THE WIRES

What came very nearly being a fatal accident occurred near Fredericton yesterday when an automobile driven by Louis Monahan went through the bridge railing at Gordon Creek, about three miles from Fredericton. There were five passengers in the car at the time and all but one received injuries. Besides the driver the passengers were Harold Linenick, George Ferguson, Ralph Synnot and Sterling Limerick. The car fell with the front part in the water and all but Ferguson were thrown out. The car is a wreck.

The jury empaneled to inquire into the death of John T. Estabrooks and Frank J. Gillis, who were killed in a run-off on the C. N. B. near Marysville on May 10, concluded their inquest on Saturday night. They came to the conclusion that Estabrooks came to his death from exposure and exhaustion and that Gillis came to his death by drowning.

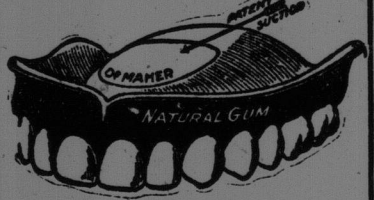
