for the Department night be the result of the agents visiting Heserves under their charge in the months of September and October in each year, as the Indians are all more likely to be on their Hearn during those months than at any other season of the year, except the time when they are being Spaid their annuities, and by the agento visiting the Weserves in those mouths, they could instruct the Indians how to harvest their crops and see that they have housed or properly fitted their root grop, and that they have provided sufficient hay to winter over properly, their cattle and Wefort to the Department, the result of their visit. I have the honor, to be, Sir, Your obedient servant Sast, pahaws Indian Superintendent.
