REILLY TRIED SUICIDE.

BELLEVEILLE, Ont., Sept. 10.—J. Reilly, who last March was convicted of conspiracy in connection with bogus ballot boxes, made an attempt to hang himself in jail here this afternoon. He had taken a sheet from his prison cot and twisted it into a rope, into a loop of which he was about to put his head when other prisoners saw him and compelled him to desist. It is said Reilly ate his dinner in good spirits. After a while he appeared to be seized with a fit of melancholy which ended in the alleged attempt at suicide. The authorities refuse to say anything about the matter, but do not deny that the story is true.
