New York, June 29—Such expansion of activity as occurred in today's stock market was traceable to the dealings in the Industrial group and in a number of specialties. The growth of activity came from the buying side of the market and a fair showing of substantial gains in prices was the result. Starting amongst the stocks of a dormant and obscure class the demand spread to the better known in dustrials, especially metal stocks and with latest and most pronounced of feet in United States Steel. American Sugar was prompt to respond favorably to the published reports that the statute of limitations had been found to operate as a bar to the proposed criminal prosecution by the federal authorities for the acts disclosed in the Pennsylvania Refining Company's litigation.
