

DEMONSTRATE BIG DITCHER AT HARTLAND

Government Operates Machine for Benefit of Farmers—Can Ditch 100 Rods a Day.

Hartland, N. B., Oct. 16.—Evidence of the government's interest in the farmers of the province was given the people in this section this week, when the large traction ditcher, purchased by the local government, arrived to do demonstration work on the farm of Clyde Rideout, about a mile and a half below here.

The local government has purchased this ditcher for the purpose of demonstrating in various parts of the province what can be done. The machine cost \$2,160, and it is suggested that where there is much land needing drainage that a company be formed for the purchase and operation of a machine.

The machine has been successfully demonstrated at the new experimental farm at Fredericton, on the C. P. R. demonstration farm at Fredericton Junction, at Moncton, Sackville, Sables Burry, and at exhibition. In most cases the ditches used have been made here by the Hartland Concrete Company.

The demonstration on Rideout's farm will commence tomorrow and continue for several days. Farmers and others from all sections are invited to see the machine in operation as it is for their benefit that it is here.

Dealers here quote produce prices today as follows: Potatoes \$0.96, bread had 9 to 10, cats 40, B. W. meal \$1.60, swine 71.2, butter 23 to 25, eggs 24 to 25, dressed pork 10 to 11.

Failure to give Civics greater attention in the past was probably owing to a lack of knowledge concerning it on the part of teachers, due, no doubt, to there being no prescribed text on the subject; also because teachers, desirous of having their pupils make a good standing in the various competitive departmental examinations, felt that their time was more profitably occupied in preparing them in the subjects exclusively required in these tests.

More prominence has been given to the teaching of civics by the action of the Board of Education in prescribing a text-book on it for the use and guidance of teachers, and in making it a requirement in the examination of teachers' licenses.

While the text is prescribed for teachers only, much better results will be obtained from the teaching of the subject with the text in the hands of the pupils. Teachers, however, are not yet allowed by the Regulations to insist that pupils provide themselves with the text.

THESE old heads of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency of Sub-Agency for the District of St. John, or at the office of any Local Agent of Dominion Lands (not sub-agent) on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within five miles of his homestead on a term of at least 90 acres, on certain conditions.

COAL—Coal mining rights may be leased for twenty-one years, renewable at an annual rental of \$1 an acre. Not more than 2,560 acres can be leased to one applicant. Royalty, five cents per ton. In unsurveyed territory the tract must be staked out by the applicant in person, and personal application to the Agent or sub-agent of Dominion Lands for the district must in all cases be made and the rental for the first year must be paid to the agent within thirty days after filing application.

CLAIMS—A person eighteen years of age and over, having made a discovery may locate a claim 1,000 feet by 1,000 feet. At least \$100 must be expended on the claim each year, or paid to the Mining Recorder. When \$100 has been expended or paid and other requirements complied with the claim may be purchased at \$1 an acre.

FLACER MINING CLAIMS are 500 feet long and from 1,000 to 2,000 feet wide. Entry fee, \$1. Not less than \$100 must be expended in development work each year.

DREDGING—Two leases of five miles each of a river may be issued to one applicant for a term of 20 years. Rental, \$10 a mile per annum. Royalty, 2 1/2 per cent after the output exceeds \$10,000.
