

CANADA'S FIRST TRADE EXPOSITION IN LONDON CLOSED

Proved a Great Success— Many Firms Had Samples on Exhibition — Expected Much Business Will Result.

London, June 21.—Canada's first exposition in London running at the Royal Agricultural Hall, was closed June 18. The object was the development of Canada's export trade, and Mr. H. Greville Montgomery was responsible for the arrangements.

The exhibition was unique in that it was open to the man in the street as well as to the various trades represented. The casual visitor was able to buy a quarter of a pound of chocolates or give an order for a quarter of a ton.

Some of the exhibitors were G. B. Keeble, Toronto (woodenware); Hill, Seddon & Co., Toronto (textiles); Steel Co. of Canada, Montreal (steel); A. Darnham & Co., Ltd., Toronto (radiators).

Belfast, June 20.—Great Britain's greatest passenger liner, the Olympic, left Belfast today for her trial cruise in the Irish sea, preparatory to a journey to Southampton, from which port she will sail for New York on June 25 on her first peacetime trip since 1914.

The Olympic is a luxury liner, and her new fittings make her "Queen of the Atlantic." Already she has been fully booked, largely by Americans who expect her to cross the Atlantic from Southampton to New York in six days.

BURDENS IMPOSED ON STOCK MARKET

Unfavorable Bank Statement, Hardening of Money Rates and Complications in Eastern Europe Hurt Trade.

New York, June 21.—An unfavorable bank statement, a sudden hardening of money rates, resumption of the railway strike and signs of fresh complications in the Eastern European situation were among the burdens imposed upon today's heavy stock market.

Although the deficit revealed in last Saturday's statement of the Clearing House was primarily due to heavy taxation payments, and, therefore, subject to speedy correction, the loss of reserves was directly responsible for today's money flurry.

Shipments, steels and food issues, as represented by the sugar group, contributed mainly to the occasional upward trend of the market with a sprinkling of chemicals and textiles.

WAYAGAMACK IN SPECTACULAR RUN

Made a Large Gain, Striking New High Ground for the Stock.

Montreal, June 21.—The spectacular trading in Wayagamack was the feature of today's business on the local stock exchange. The issue opened at 2 1/4 points up at 1 1/2, and sold as high as 124, closing at 123 3/4, a net gain of seven quarter points.
