

INCOME.

The following remittances from the Local Committees have been received during the past year:—

ANNAPOLIS.—From this Mission has been forwarded the very handsome sum of £31 6s. 9d. The Rev. E. Gilpin, in transmitting it, writes in the most encouraging strain, and assures us "that the interest of his people, in the design and advancement of the Church Society, is gradually gaining that strength which it ought to possess."

AYLESFORD.—The contributions of this Mission have very largely increased during the present year, amounting to £19, inclusive of £1, contributed by Mr. W. Tupper, in aid of Missions to the Heathen.

BRIDGETOWN.—The sum of £11 15s. 9d. has been received from this Mission, which shews a slight falling off from that of the preceding year, not from any want of zeal in the Society's cause, as the Rev. Mr. Robertson assures us, but from the force and pressure of local circumstances.

BARRINGTON.—From this place, which has not yet had the advantage of a stated Minister, the Rev. Mr. Snyder has transmitted the sum of £3.

CHESTER.—The Rev. Dr. Shreve has transmitted from this Mission the sum of £15, conveying, at the same time, the good wishes, both of himself and people, for the continued prosperity of the Society.

CORNWALLIS AND HORTON.—The remittance from this Branch is £8 15s. 10d. The annual subscriptions, we are informed, have not decreased, but the Missionary's health not having permitted him to exert himself as formerly, the amount forwarded is not quite so large as in the preceding year.

DARTMOUTH.—The exertions of this Branch are worthy of the highest commendation. The amount collected this year is £26 1s. 8d., a fact which seems to say that they are determined to take their stand, as formerly, in the front rank of the auxiliaries of the Society.
