A Message from His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by Mr. Secretary George :

Mr. Speaker,

His Excellency commands this House to attend His Excellency immediately in the Council Chamber.

Accordingly Mr. Speaker, with the House, went up to attend His Excellency in the Council Chamber, where His Excellency was pleased to give his Assent to the several Bills following, *Viz* :

An Act for the better supplying the Town of Halifax with Fresh Water.

An Act to empower the Lieutenant-Governor or Commander in Chief for the time being, to appoint Commissioners to Issue Treasury Notes.

An Act to revive, alter and continue, the several Acts of the General Assembly, now in force, relating to a Militia.

An Act to regulate the Summary Trial of Actions in the Supreme Court and Inferior Courts of Common Pleas.

An Act to regulate the manner of taking the Bonds of Sheriffs, Collectors of Impost and Excise, and of the Treasurer of the Province.

An Act to continue in force the several Acts therein mentioned.

After which Mr. Speaker spake as follows :

*May it please Your Excellency,*

**I**T is my duty, on the behalf of His Majesty's Faithful Subjects the Commons of Nova-Scotia, to present to your Excellency a Bill for appropriating the Supplies granted to His Majesty during the present Session of the General Assembly, and to request your Excellency's Assent thereto.

These Appropriations, though large, were only limited by the Finances of the Province: they would have been larger had they been equal to the wishes of the Assembly, or to their confidence in your Excellency. Economy and prudence, in the disposition of the Public Money, are, in the estimation of the Members of this Assembly, amongst the first duties of the Representatives of the
