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Dr. MacBeth to Mr. R.D. Ross, President of the
Toronto Men's Liberal Association.

Mr. Ross deals with this MacBeth case in
his evidence on the Hearing herein (Page 309) as
Dr. Arnold knows, even though he has forgotten the
situation complained of by Dr. MacBeth at the time.
Dr. MacBeth has far from forgotten the political
discrimination shown by Dr. Arnold; as is evidenced
from Dr. MacBeth's letter to his brother, dated
from Los Angeles, only last month; when his brother,
Mr. J.C.M. MacBeth, in his evidence on the Hearing
(Page 59) arranged to communicate with Dr. MacBeth,
in this connection, to confirm his recollection.

The letter reads as follows:

"Dear John:

Regarding the statement referring
to Christie Street Hospital, I do not feel
disposed, when not there to defend myself,
to have the veracity of my remarks question-
ed, as it naturally would be by such low-
grades as both Arnold and Hewitt. Albeit,
it is quite true that Arnold, in Hewitt's
office, and before Hewitt, asked me, point-
blank, what my politics were. I later dis-
closed this conversation to Megaffin; who,
I believe, mentioned it to Hewitt, who, in
turn, went to the trouble of trying to
impress on me that Arnold didn't mean any-
thing by his remark -- that Arnold didn't care
