Dear Mrs. Goodwin:

I have just received your letter of 15th this morning and have read it carefully. I cannot see anything you can do except to enter an appeal to the Appeal Board of Ontario. This Appeal Board is headed by Mr. Justice Hops, who should be a very competent man. It is too bad that you have to do this.

As perhaps you know, I have no sympathy for this Farmers' Creditors' Arrangement Act now at all. The way it has worked out has quite convinced me that it has done harm, particularly in our Central and Eastern Provinces. While it is law, though, the only thing to do is to seize any method of setting right what harm is done. You will be better to have a lawyer and will know yourself who best to speak to on the subject.
