the Chief's views; and at the same time que him to understand that the forcomment does not recognize any rights of Leoux Indians to Canadian besitny; that Reserves on Bir Sail Greek, on bak River and at lan Lake were, as an act of grace, allotted the Lious of the 1862 massares; and that, if he and his people choose to go to one of three Receives, arrange. ments will be made to that end. But they cannot have a separate accerve; nor should they encourage any Indians of the United States to come over the boundary line to settle on Canadian lands; and that, if they do so, wither three Indians, nor they will be allowed land even on the Recesoes store named. fam, Sir, free House - Depuis of the Sufficients
