
Sir,

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 11th inst. in reference to the matter of erecting a small addition to the Mississauga school-house for the accommodation of the teacher, and in reply I beg to say that on July 2, last, you were informed that, if it is the wish of the band that such an addition should be made to the building, you should obtain a resolution of the band in council to this effect, authorizing the expenditure of the necessary funds from their capital.

The Department has been awaiting your reply to that letter. You were asked to give it your immediate attention so that preparations for building could be made at once, if the band wished to carry out the suggestion.

The Department cannot authorize this work to be undertaken, until the above conditions are complied with, and as it is now getting late in the season, the matter should be taken up at once and the Department advised.
