Sir,-

With reference to your letter of the 28th of November last, in regard to employment of culler, I have to inform you that as soon as a sufficient number of logs shall be ready to measure, you should notify Mr. Colin McDonald, of Midland, to commence work.

The Department would like to hear from you as to whether the work is now going on satisfactorily on the Island, or otherwise; and whether there is communication between the Island and the mainland; also as to whether the Indians are reconciled to the Company's foreman who was removed from the Island.

The number of logs made, and skidded to date should be ascertained and reported without delay.
