FOREWORD

It is desirable that the reader shall keep in mind that all the problems dealt with hereafter are purely suggestions for Basic Plans, upon which, it is realized, further development will undoubtedly be necessary. Such development can be better accomplished for the benefit of all by the collaboration and co-operation of all parties representing all peoples, through the medium of an International Court organization, as already outlined in Book I, Section B, Page 20. It is suggested that to accomplish this there shall be formed within and from among the members of the International Court various sub-councils, similar to that suggested for Regional Control, Section C, Page 27, Book I. All nations, large or small, will be able to present their special problems to such sub-councils, and be able to receive reliable and unbiased information and general assistance in the adjustment of various international problems, in a reasonable and amicable manner, with freedom from Doubt, Suspicion and Fear. They would be secure in the knowledge that before any action can be taken by any nation, group of nations, individual, group of individuals, or organizations, in any field of activity, the whole assembly of the International Court, representative of the whole of humanity, must pass final judgement. without fear or favour, in the interests of mankind, and for the preservation of world peace and security. Each sub-council shall deal with a particular problem only. They shall be known as: --
