arbitrary valuations done away with on all but a few special items;

Reductions in Canadian tariff and removal of other obstacles to trade have served not only to increase the exchange of goods with other countries, but, in addition, have brought relief to producers and consumers in Canada - e.g. reductions on articles of general

food, clothing, household goods;
while tariff changes have benefitted all Canadians,
emphasis has been upon implements and materials
entering into production -

lower production costs have enabled Canadian producers and exporters more successfully to meet foreign competition alike in world markets and at home;
