Question.

Q. 6 \*Do you wish to apply for an adjournment on the ground that any of the rules relating to procedure before trial have not been complied with, and that you have been prejudiced thereby, or on the ground that you have not had sufficient opportunity for preparing your defence?

First witness for prosecution.

being duly sworn, is examined by the prosecutor.

- Q. 7 What is your appointment?
- A. I am Assistant Judge-Advocate General for Military District No. 5.
- Q. 8 Do you know the accused?
- A. Yes I do. He is Pte. (A/Sgt. Lindberg.) I met him in the beginning of May 1944. (The witness points out accused)
- Q. 9 Will you tell the Court the circumstances in which you met him?
- A. I met him at the 1st War Disease Control Station, in May, on a District Court Martial on which I was detailed as Judge-Advocate.
- Q.10 By whom the District Court Martial had been convened?
- A. The District Court Martial had been convened by the District Officer Commanding, Military District No. 5.
- Q.11 Do you have the Convening Order of this District Court Martial?
- A. Yes I actually have the custody of the original proceedings of the District Court Martial held on the 4th day of May 1944, in the case of J.C. Beamish. I have here a certified true copy of the Convening Order.
