ANECDOTE.

About the time of Henry VII. or perhaps earlier, the town was in itself a palatinate, and all the law proceedings ran in the name of the mayor, who had also the power of pardoning or condemning criminals .- John de Burgh, then Mayor, was a very opulent merchant, and traded largely, especially with Cadiz in Spain .- On fome occation he fent over his only fon with a cargo to Don Alonzo Herrera, his correspondent there, who received young De Burgh with the greatest hospitality; and on his departure he fent with him on a vifit his own fon, together with a very large fum in fpecie, to purchase merchandize .- The young De Burgh, tempted by
