HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

Any even numbered section of Dominion ands in Manitoba or the North-west Territories, excepting 8 and 50, which has not been homestcaded, or reserved to provide wood too for settlers, or for other purposes, may be homestcaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of ago, to the extent of one-quarter scattering of the process of the proces

ENTRY.

Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the District in which the land to be taken in situate, or if the homesteader desires he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottaws, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the Local Agent for the district in which the land his situate, receive authority for some one to make entry for him. A fee of \$\frac{1}{2}\$ to charged for a homestead entry

HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act and the amendments thereto to perform the conditions connected herewith, under one of the following plans:—

(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) or any person who is eligible to make a homestead energy farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such person as a homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.

(3) If a sottler has obtained a patent for his homestead, or a certificate for the issue of such patent countersigned in themanuer present of the patent of

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his household, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.

A settler who avails himself of the provision⁸ of Clauses (2)(3) or (4) must cultivate 30 acres of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of stock, with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides 30 acres substantially fenced.

Every homesteader who fails to comply with the requirements of the homesteader law is liable to have his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT

Should be made at the end of the three years before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the Homestead Inspector. Before making applica-tion for patent the settler must give six months notice in writing to the Commissioner of Dominion Landa at Ottawa of his intention to
