E it enacted by the king's most excellent majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the legislative council and affembly of the province of Upper-Canada, constituted and affembled by virtue of, and under the authority of an act paffed in the parliament of Great-Britain, entitled "An act to repeal certain parts of an act passed in the fourteenth year of his majesty's reign, entitled, " An act for making more effectual provision for the government of the province of Quebec in North America, and to make further provision for the government of the faid province," and by the authority of the fame, That from and after the paffing of this act, and before the first day of Trinity term now next ensuing, and before the first day of the respective terms next preceding the time when the issuing of the writs of assize and nisi prius are directed to be issued, according to the form and effect of a certain act passed in the thirty-fourth year of his majesty's reign, entitled, " An act to establish a superior court of civil and crimin I jurisdiction and to regulate the court of appeal," and in every year thereafter enfuing, the theriffs of the Eastern, Midland and Western districts, and each respectively, shall cause a pannel of the names of the jurors, not less than thirty-fix, nor more than forty-eight persons, according to the rules and regulations contained in the said act entitled, "An act for the regulation of juries," to be transmitted into his majesty's court of his bench, that shall be liable to be summoned for the trial of all causes at the then next ensuing affizes, without a venire facias for that purpose.

The fheriff f the Home diftrict, to return in like m n ner, on first day of e.e y term. II. And be it further enacted, That the sheriff of the Home district on or before the first day of every term, shall cause a pannel of the names of jurors, not less than thirty-six nor more than forty-eight, according to the rules and regulations of the said act for the regulation of juries, to be transmitted into his said majesty's court of his bench, of persons that shall be liable to be summoned for the trial of all causes at the sittings during and ensuing each term, without a venire sacias for that purpose.

Keepers of in s &c to be licen ced, E it enacted by the king's most excellent majesty by and with the advice and consent of the legislative council and assembly of the province of Upper-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an ast passed in the parliament of Great-Britain, entitled "An ast to repeal certain parts of an ast passed in the sourceenth year of his majesty's reign, entitled, "An ast for making more effectual provision for the government of the province of Quebec in North America, and to make surther provision for the government of the said province," and by the authority of the same, That from and after the passing of this ast, if any person or persons shall keep an inn or public house for the purpose of vending wine, brandy, rum or other spiritous liquors; unless he, she or they shall have previously obtained a licence in manner and form prescribed, by an ast passed in the thirty-sourth year of his majesty's reign, entitled, "An ast for regulating the manner of licensing public houses;
