THE BULGARIANS

London, Sept. 11—The British troops, in their advance across the Struma, in the region of Lake Tahinos, have driven the Bulgarians from four villages, says a war office statement on the operations in Macedonia, issued tonight. The British also repulsed strong Bulgarian counter-attacks. The announcement follows:

"Our detachments crossed the Struma yesterday afternoon at Nechori and several places about Lake Tahinos.

"After considerable opposition we expelled the enemy from the following villages: Oraorman, east of Bajraktarmáh, upper and lower Guedeli and Nevolyen. The enemy counter-attacked strongly, but was repulsed with the loss of prisoners, the number of which has not yet been ascertained."
