CATTLE MARKETS.

Montreal Live Stock.
MONTREAL, July 10.—(Special).—About 200 head of butchers' cattle, 250 calves, 50 milch cows, 400 sheep and lambs and 200 fat hogs were offered for sale at the East End Abattoir. Nearly one-half of the small stock did not reach the market until nearly noon. A few head of choice western cattle sold at from 50 to 75c per lb. None of the others brought over 25c per lb., and from that down to 25c per lb. for small bulls.

There was quite a number of good milch cows on the market, but even these are dull of sale, and 25c is about the top price, and from that down to 20c for the smallest ones.

Calves sold at from 25c to 30c each. Shippers paid 45c per lb. for good large sheep. Lambs sold at from 25c to 30c each. Good lots of fat hogs sold at from 20c to 25c.
