Failures Last Week.

Failures Last Week. May 30.—Commercial failures this week in the United States, as reported by R. G. Dun & Co. are 277 against 336 inst week, 286 the preceding week and 165 the corresponding week last year. Failures in Canada number 18, against 41 last week, 25 the preceding week and 10 last year. Of failures this week in the United States, 101 were in the East, 84 South, 69 West, and 23 in the Pacific States, and 100 report Habilities of 55, 000 or more against 129 last week, Lia-bilities of commercial failures thus far reported for May are \$11,302,332, as against \$81,146,897 for the same per-iod the previous year. Dun's Review. Industrial conditions continue to im-prove and arrangements have been made for the resumption of many plants next week, while retail trade is increased by seasonable weather.
