BOSTON, Dec. 3. Twenty-five men were killed to-day a fire which swept through the opper floors of the Arcadia Hotel, a en's cheap lodging house at the Others are missing, and scores have been taken to hospitals suffering from burns and injuries, re ceived through jumping from dows. Nearly all the bodies are ter ribly burned, making identificational almost impossible. The victims ar poor circumstances, who had resorted to the place for a night's odging. Many were caught in th crowded bunks of the top floor of the five-story brick building. In the small rooms on the fourth floor the were helpless. Practically all the men were naked. Many were rescued by the firemen and police. Others caped by walking on a shaky plank stretched to an adjoining building, or jumping across a five-foot alley to the eighboring roofs. The property loss estimated at \$25,000.

JUAREZ, Dec. 3. Confident that the seven federal generals, who evacuated Chihuahua City, with their troops, intend to seek safety in the United States, and thus be beyond danger of being taken prisoners by the rebels, General Villa, today, sent more troops to attempt to intercept them. The Generals are led by Mercado, whose desertion of Chi-huahua, and statements that he had no money to pay the troops, are re garded as a virtual breakdown of the Huerta dictatorship, so far as North Mexico is concerned. It is thought they will cross the River Presidiono, at Presidio, and it is expected will be arrested by the United States military authorities, and taken to Marena and thence to San Antonio.
