Much evidence has lately been adduced to show that gas is more useful than the electric light in promoting efficient ventilation of air. It is for this. amongst other reasons, that gas is being frequently substituted for the electric light. The latest example is, perhaps, the Society of Medical Officers of Health, which has recently installed gas on its premises, after experience with the electric light .- Dr. Jamieson
