THE U.S. CONGRESS

Adjourned Amid a Great Patriotic Demonstation.

Cabinet Calculating on Raising Considerable War Revenue on Philippine Trade.

Washington, July 9.- The galleries of the Senate presented a brilliant sight at the opening of yesterday's session, They were packed to the doors with National Education Association visitors, a large majority of whom were

women. Mr. Allison reported from the committee on appropriations the House resolution providing for the adjournment at 2 o'clock, and urged its passage. Mr. Morgan (Alabama) opposed proposed adjournment, maintaining that it would be far more desirable for Congress to take a recess until the first Monday in September. "It seems to me," he said, "that the war with Spain is drawing to a conclusion. The ending of the war will bring to

Congress questions of gravest importance in our history.' Washington, July 9.-The House adjourned at 2 p.m. yesterday. Immedi ately there were cheers, followed by singing of patriotic songs. Representative Bromwell, of Ohio, proposed three cheers for President McKinley, which were given twice over by the Republicans. Then followed cheers, joined in by the entire House, for Admiral Dewev and Gen. Joe Wheeler. The whole house was one vast demonstration, and flags were passed about to every mem-

ber while the members sang the close of the 55th Congress. A large share of yesterday's cabinet meeting was consumed in the reading and discussion of the new tariff schedule to be put in operation in the Philippine Islands as soon as our forces shall have taken possession of Manila. The formal announcement by the president of his purpose to collect the customs of the Philippines as a war revenue had been prepared, and after a discussion lasting an hour or two, it was referred to the secretary of state, together with the schedule for a final examination. It is probable that the president's declaration will be issued within the next two or three days.
